

Licence for publication of a WHO article in a journal

1. WHO hereby grants ... (“the Publisher”) the non-exclusive, worldwide, royalty-free right to reproduce in print and in electronic formats on its servers, and to permit such reproduction on the servers of its licensees, the following manuscript (“the Manuscript”) in the Journal of (“the Journal”) and to distribute and sell the Manuscript within the Journal:

2. Copyright in the Manuscript remains exclusively vested in the World Health Organization (WHO) and no rights, other than the ones explicitly provided herein, are being granted. The rights granted to the Publisher hereunder may not be sublicensed, transferred or assigned, without the prior written agreement of WHO, excepting that the Publisher is authorized to handle permissions requests from third parties to reproduce parts of the article.
3. The Publisher shall
EITHER: print the following copyright notice with the publication of the Manuscript:

© World Health Organization [year].
All rights reserved. The World Health Organization has granted the Publisher permission for the reproduction of this article.

OR: otherwise acknowledge in the Work, in an acknowledgement consistent with the style of acknowledgements in the Work, WHO’s copyright in the Manuscript and permission to publish the Manuscript in the Work.

4. Neither the Publisher nor its licensees shall publish the Manuscript in connection with the promotion of any commercial company, its products or services.
5. WHO confirms that it is legally entitled to grant the Publisher the aforesaid rights. To the best of WHO’s knowledge, the Manuscript does not violate or infringe on the rights of any third party. WHO has exercised reasonable care to ensure that the Manuscript is accurate.
6. The Publisher shall provide WHO with ... complementary copies of the above-mentioned issue of the Journal.
7. Any dispute relating to the interpretation or application of this Agreement shall, unless amicably settled, be subject to conciliation. In the event of failure of the latter, the dispute shall be settled by arbitration. The arbitration shall be conducted in accordance with the modalities to be agreed upon by the parties or, in the absence of agreement, with the rules of arbitration of the International Chamber of Commerce. The parties shall accept the arbitral award as final.
